This item considers the purchase of one 3,250-gallon deicer spray truck to be used at the Rick Husband Amarillo International Airport for deicing runway and taxiway areas during inclement weather. This truck will replace an old truck from 1986 that has far exceeded its useful life. This was previously approved by City Council on August 13, 2024, but the Airport was more recently able to obtain Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) funding approval for an FAA AIP Grant by utilizing the vendor's HGAC co-op contract instead of the vendor's Sourcewell co-op contract, while maintaining the same price and the same vendor, thereby lowering the cost to the Airport by 95%.
