Dear Mr. Eckstein:

This is to inform you that your application for subzone status at the facility of Fermi, Inc., located in Panhandle, Texas (Subzone 252B) is approved, pursuant to Section 400.36(f) of the Foreign-Trade Zones (FTZ) Board's regulations. As requested in your application, the subzone is subject to the 2,000-acre activation limit of FTZ 252. Please note that this action does not imply authority for any production activity requiring advance approval by the FTZ Board. Finally, as a reminder, a subzone "lapses" (15 CFR Sec. 400.13(a)(4)) if the subzone has not activated within five years from its authorization date (*i.e.*, by August 17, 2031, for Subzone 252B).

We have incorporated this action into the zone information for FTZ 252 – which you may consult at any point in the Online FTZ Information System on our website (accessible via www.trade.gov/ftz). We ask that you retain the application and approval documents in your zone file and update your zone records in accordance with the FTZ Board regulations (15 CFR Sec. 400.51).
